Terms and Conditions of the SRCFA raffle for the L39 Ride

1. Ticket prices are \$20 each.
2. Only 500 tickets printed.
3. If all tickets are sold by December 19, 2011 the draw will be at 5pm December 20, 2011 in Sherwood Park, AB. If all tickets are not sold by Dec 19, then the final draw will be Mar 19, 2012.
4. Prize has no redeemable cash value but is transferable.
5. SRCFA is not responsible if the winner is unable to do the flight.
6. L39 Ride for the Winner will be flown out of the Josephburg Airport, 8 km northeast of Fort Saskatchewan.

7. Date for the ride will be negotiated between the successful winner and Ed McDonald – it may or may not be a weekend.

8. Flexibility in setting a date will be required and there is a possibility of rescheduling due to weather.

9. 2012 Spring to Fall period is the best time (strapping into the aircraft in the winter is not a lot of fun).

10. Prior to the flight there will be a one hour briefing that will include safety items as well a description of what will be done during the flight.

11. The flight can be as mild or as aggressive as the rider wishes. It can go from a sight seeing tour to aerobatic maneuvers and everything in between.

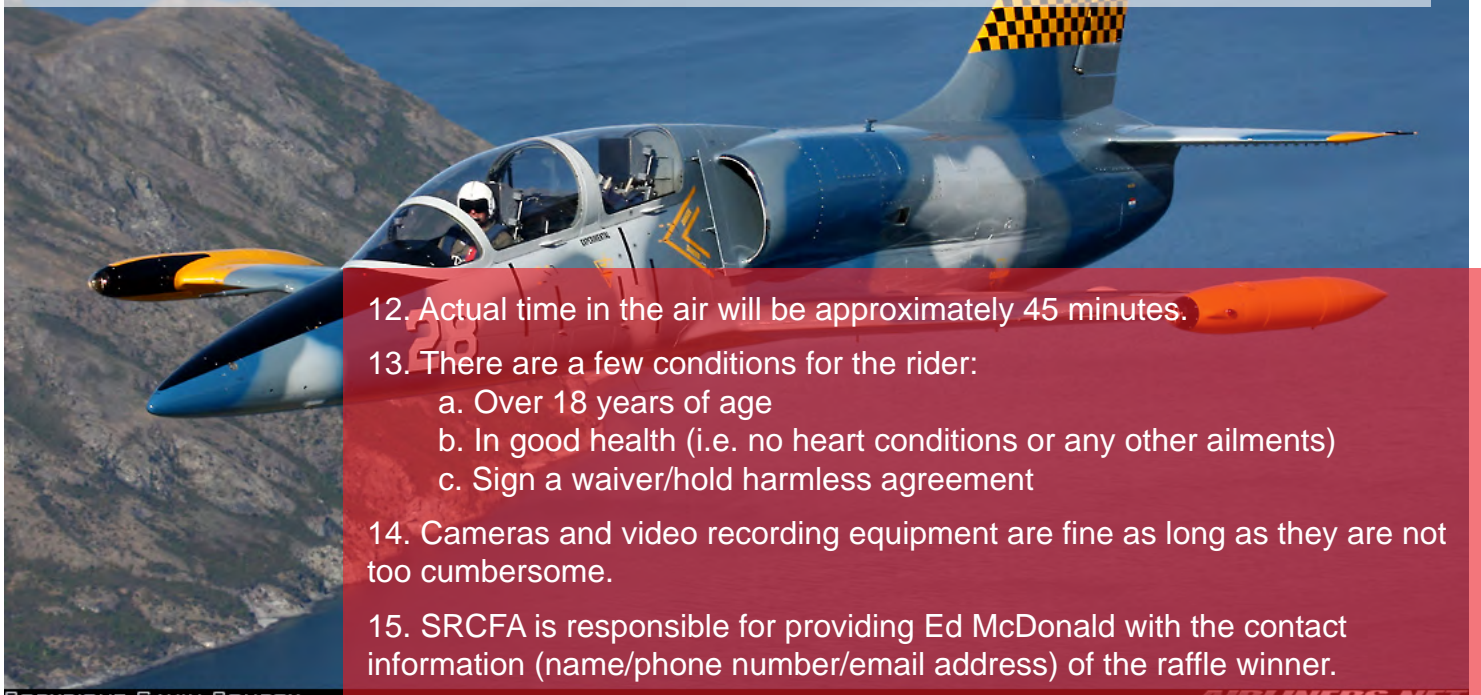
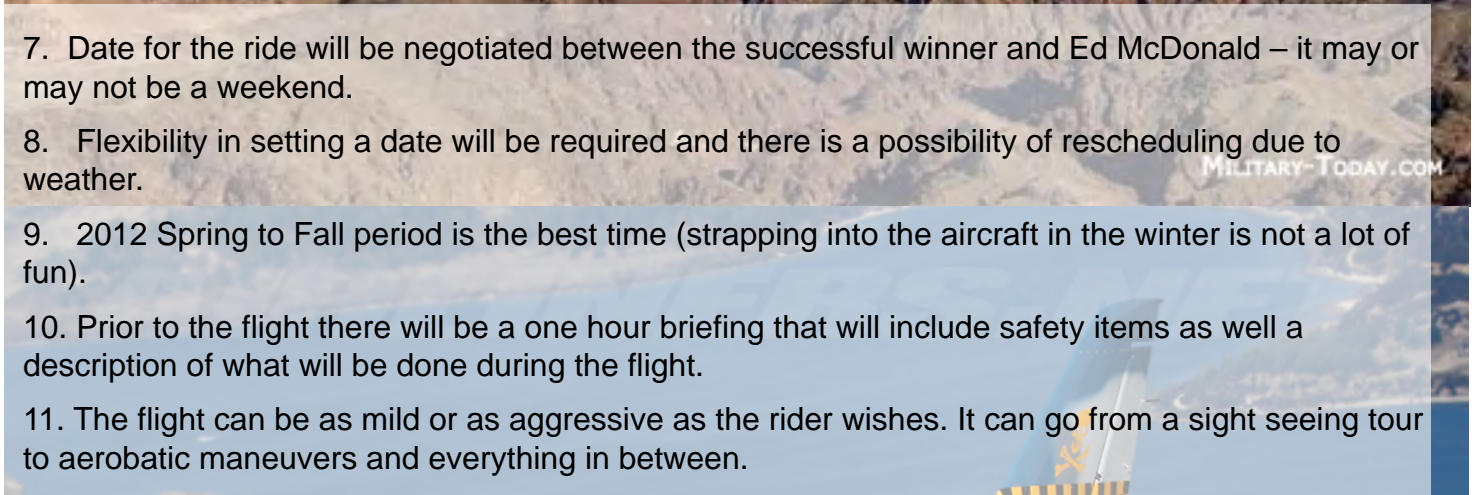
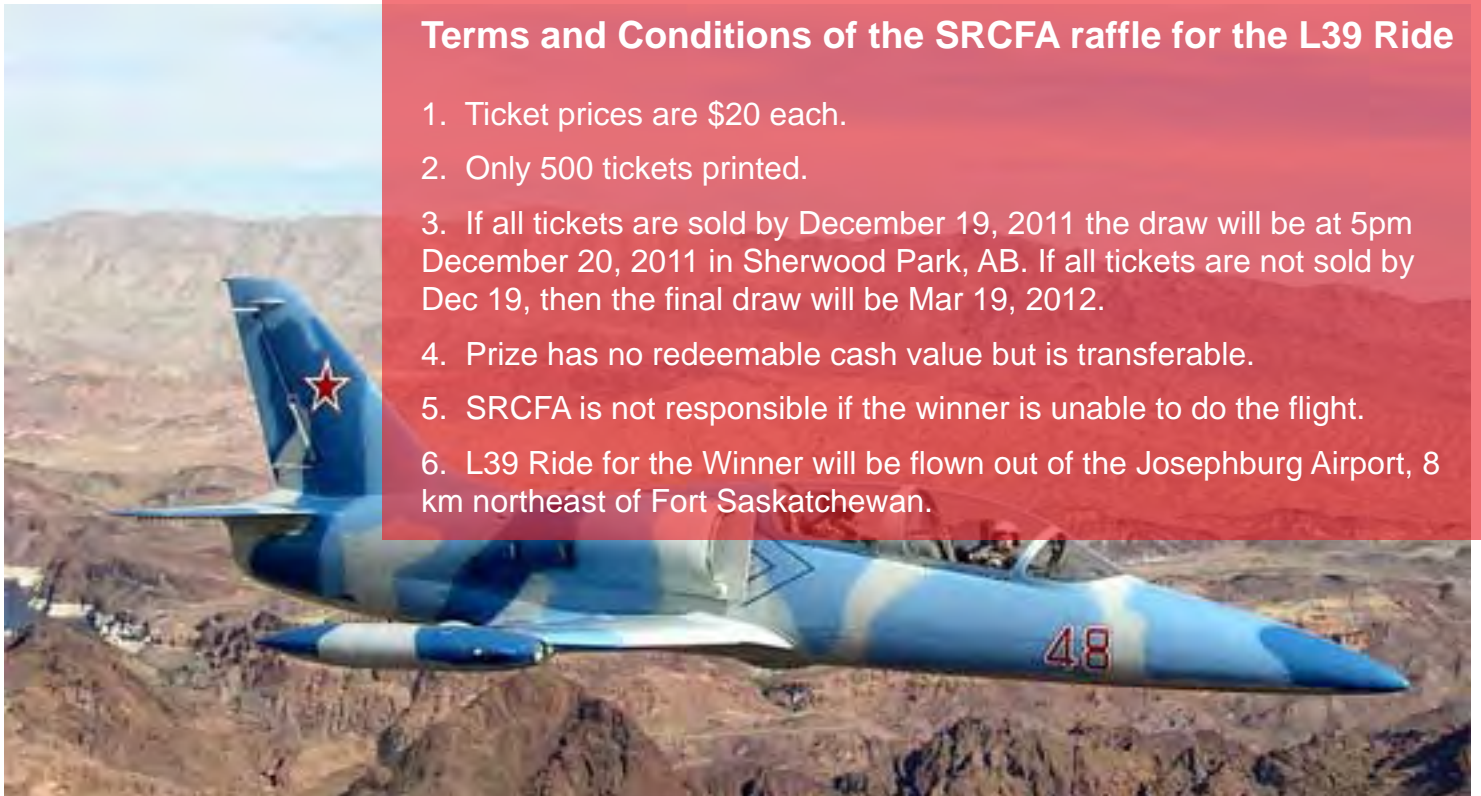
12. Actual time in the air will be approximately 45 minutes.

13. There are a few conditions for the rider:

- a. Over 18 years of age
- b. In good health (i.e. no heart conditions or any other ailments)
- c. Sign a waiver/hold harmless agreement

14. Cameras and video recording equipment are fine as long as they are not too cumbersome.

15. SRCFA is responsible for providing Ed McDonald with the contact information (name/phone number/email address) of the raffle winner.



SRCFA, Alexander First Nation Education and the Wapski Mahikan Society are partnering to raise funds for an extraordinary experience for a group of high school students from Kipohtakaw Education Centre and we need your help. Kipohtakaw Education Centre is a K-12 school located on Alexander First Nation approximately 40 km outside of Edmonton. On March 22, 2012 we will be taking 10 students on a 10 day volunteer trip to Costa Rica, Central America. Our trip will consist of three parts:

- 1. A Humanitarian Project** – students will be volunteering at the FUDEBIOL nature reserve in Las Quebradas, Costa Rica where they will be assisting with the preservation of a river basin which provides the only potable water source in the area
- 2. A Cultural Exchange** – students will be staying with host families in the community of Las Quebradas where they will have the opportunity to not only learn about daily life in Costa Rica but will also share their Cree culture with their host families, the community and local school children
- 3. Sightseeing** – students will have the opportunity to experience several sights while in Costa Rica including a visit to a Boruca community (the Boruca are the indigenous people of Costa Rica), zip lining in the rain forest, and spending time at the Pacific Ocean

This will be our third trip to Costa Rica. Our previous two trips were highly successful and rewarding for the students who were chosen to make the journey. This type of educational trip is truly a once in a life time opportunity for First Nations youth to travel to another country and experience a cultural exchange while participating in a humanitarian project. The trip is facilitated by the organization *United Planet*. *United Planet* is renowned for these types of student excursions.
